Pastor's Report

• Infrastructure work for the new church is complete. Construction on the church building has encountered a rain delay, but is expected to begin on 4/21/2025. During construction, Fr. Randy's garage will be utilized for the construction office. Materials will be stored on the north parking lot. Construction will be managed by Columbia Construction. Bishop Rice has signed the \$13.5 million contract for the construction of the church, which does not include construction of the new rectory or offices.

- Parish Council continues to update the work being done on the Parish Pastoral Plan for Moving from Maintenance to Mission, with the priorities of Growing in Holiness, Forming Intentional Disciples and being Sent to Witness as set forth by Bishop Rice. Committees reported on their progress:

Outside Communications:

Voice for Life winners were published in the Mirror.

Principal's report (Ms. Campbell):

- Current enrollment: 41 students in Pre-K, 134 students K-8.
 - Approximately 10 more students have reached out with interest in joining IC next year.
 - Expecting around 5 students not to return next year.
- We did very well on the Self-Study. The visiting team report was reviewed by the School Board. Next steps will be to create a long-range (5-year) plan, following the format provided by Deacon Huff.
 - Page 1: Recommendations we want to move forward with. (Ms. Campbell is working on this now.)
 - Pages 2 & 3: Objective Details & Action Plans (Work on this will begin in August.)
- Tuition & Tuition Contracts:
 - A new contract format was discussed, including visual discounts.
 - MOScholars: We will find out in June or July how many students qualify and how much they will receive. Qualifying students may receive \$7145.
 - Bright Futures is available to Springfield-Cape Girardeau and Kansas City Dioceses. Donations fund Bright Futures.
 There are tax incentives for donors.
- Ms. Barb Elfrink accepted the 5th Grade teaching position.
- School Board, Home & School, and Athletic Committee elections close 4/16/25.
- Will continue to take applications for Summer Care through the end of the month. Currently, there are 27 students signed up,
 with 8 of those being full-time. Ms. Stephanie Starke will be overseeing the program.

Committee Reports:

- Athletic Committee (Ms. Brunke) Boys' Volleyball had a 6-2 record. Mr. Bova is waiting for an update on the roof, before
 moving forward with gym floor plans. The floor will likely have to wait until next summer. MSHSAA approved St. Sebastian
 track and field and cross country.
- Christian Service (Ms. Campbell) The 8th Grade class has completed all service hour requirements. The 7th Grade class continues to work on their hours.
- Home and School (Ms. Ralls) Spring Fling raised \$123,914. Imo's restaurant night will be 4/23/25. Teacher Appreciation
 Week planning is underway. A luau-themed mouse race fundraiser is being planned for 9/5/25 at the Jackson KC Hall.
- Marketing Committee (Ms. Gibbs) Will be working with Paul Kester to update LoveWhatIC. Planning the next bulletin
 insert. Still considering a digital billboard.
- Parish Council (Mr. Holzum) The Parish Picnic is planned for August. Ordering more ID bracelets. Recognized different committees. Next meeting is scheduled 4/16/25.

Old Business:

Gym Roof Leak Update: Water testing was completed. Two holes were patched. Mr. Holzum will work with Mr. Starke to fix the
fan and electrical fittings that are leaking.

New Business:

- If there was not enough money raised to cover a teacher's wish list item, Home and School will hold the money donated until
 enough money has been raised to cover the cost of the item
- Mr. Holzum offered to work on the GaGa Ball pit.
- School Nurse Barbie Gibbs will be attending an educational session regarding measles.


