Sacred Triduum

The word "Triduum" comes from the Latin word meaning "three days," and encompasses the three most sacred days of the Church year. It begins at sundown on Holy Thursday, reaches a high point at the Easter Vigil, and concludes with evening prayer at sundown on Easter Sunday. The liturgical celebrations during the Triddum are intended to be one continuous celebration that commemorates the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus. For this reason, Catholics are encouraged to observe the entire Triduum by attending all of the liturgies.
