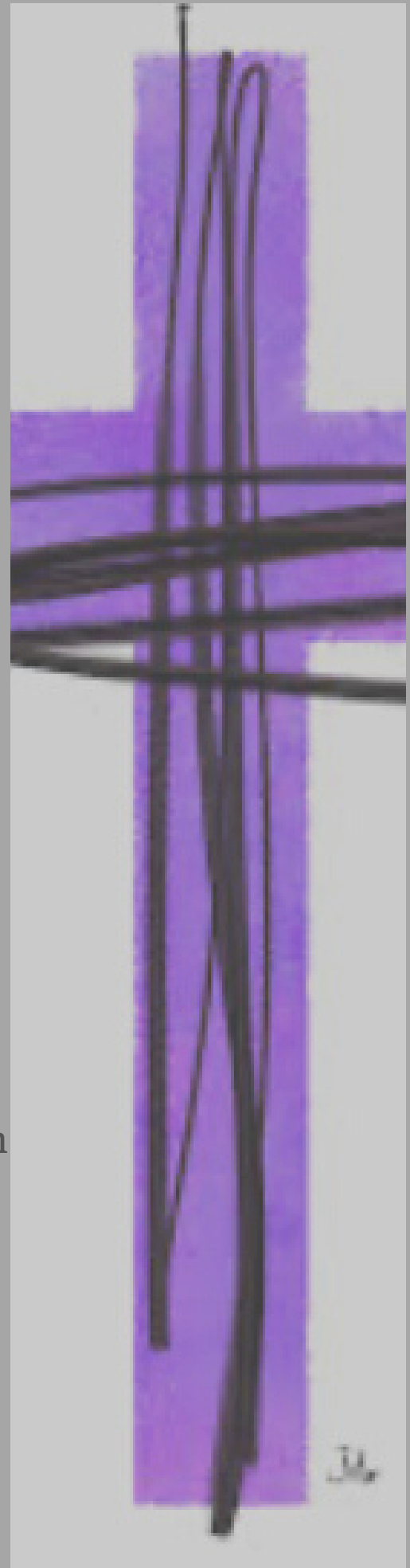

Sacred Triduum

The word "Triduum" comes from the Latin word meaning "three days," and encompasses the three most sacred days of the Church year. It begins at sundown on Holy Thursday, reaches a high point at the Easter Vigil, and concludes with evening prayer at sundown on Easter Sunday. The liturgical celebrations during the Triduum are intended to be one continuous celebration that commemorates the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus. For this reason, Catholics are encouraged to observe the entire Triduum by attending all of the liturgies.

40

40 has symbolic value in the Bible. It reminds us of Jesus' 40 day fast in the wilderness and the 40 years the Israelites spent wandering in the wilderness before entering the Promised Land.

Ashes

Ashes are normally made from blessed palm branches from the previous Palm Sunday. They are sprinkled with Holy Water and incensed.

Holy Week

Catholics have honored the last week of Jesus' life since the Apostles. Holy Week is a time to reflect on all Jesus suffered for us.
